

FAIRVIEW at PRESCOTT - The Cardinals began the night's scoring with a 25 yard field goal. Each team scored a touchdown in the first half and Fairview stayed ahead until Terry Spearman made a touchdown late in the fourth quarter. Prescott 14- Fairview 10.
